



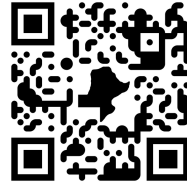
South Texas Border Chapter of Texas Master Naturalist program is organized exclusively for charitable, scientific, and educational purposes.

Classes and Field Trips

Classes are given by local experts on Thursday evenings, 6:00 to 9:00 pm at St. George Orthodox Church Hall, Pharr. Classes will meet in-person.

Field trips will be mainly on Saturdays with some weekdays and nights. They include visits to natural areas, state parks, national wildlife areas, and world birding centers.

Field trip time beyond the required ten hours counts as advanced training toward TMN Certification.

Master Naturalist Certification and Annual Recertification require service hours and additional training.

Class Completion Certificate requires:

- 30 hours of Classroom Instruction
- 10 hours of Field Trips

TMN Certification requires additional:

- 8 hours Advanced Training
- 40 hours Volunteer Work

Annual Recertification requires:

- 8 hours Advanced Training
- 40 hours Volunteer Work
