# **Classes and Field Trips**

Classes will be Online for everyone's safety due to COVID-19.

Online Classes will be given by local experts on Tuesdays, 6:00 to 9:00 pm.

Field trips will be mainly on Saturday and Sunday outdoors, in person. They include visits to natural areas, state parks, national wildlife areas and world birding centers.

Field trip time beyond the required hours counts toward your certification. Texas Master Naturalist Certification and Annual Recertification require service hours and additional training.

### **Class Completion Certificate requires:**

- 30 hours of Classroom Instruction
- 10 hours of Field Trips

### **TMN** Certification requires additional:

- 8 hours Advanced Training
- 40 hours Volunteer Work

### **Annual Recertification requires:**

- 8 hours Advanced Training
- 40 hours Volunteer Work
